
As we approach the final stretch of this academic year, we would like to provide you with some important updates and reminders regarding upcoming events and expectations here at Eastland.

We are nearing the conclusion of state testing, and soon we will transition to I-Ready testing for Math and ELA. It cannot be overstated how crucial it is for our students to put forth their best efforts during these assessments. We aim for each student to demonstrate growth compared to their January I-Ready test scores. It is not only about achieving high scores, it's also about showing progress and readiness for the next academic level.

It's worth emphasizing that students who do not actively participate or score below expectations may be assigned to ELA or Math intervention classes. Our priority is to ensure that every student is placed in the appropriate classes to support their individual learning needs. Therefore, we urge all students to give their utmost effort during these assessments.

I would also like to point out as the weather warms up, we kindly remind students to adhere to the school's dress code policy.
