I also wanted to inform everyone that April not only brings us spring, but it also begins State Testing.

To kick off testing, the 8th graders will take the PSAT test on April 10th. Please make sure we are on time at 7:40 am. We will also be providing a nice breakfast for 8th grade students from 7:20-7:40 am in the Cafeteria. This is a day that only 8th grade students report to school. 6th and 7th grade students will have this day off. The PSAT will end around 11:30am. Then the 8th graders will be released. Additionally, all students will take the M-STEP. Finally, the I-Ready will be administered throughout the month of May. There will be more information to come regarding I-ready and M-STEP.

For the months of April and May, we ask for students to be prepared for these assessments by getting a full night's sleep and putting forth their best effort. These exams are an opportunity to showcase the students' knowledge and skills. Let's approach these assessments with a prepared, positive attitude, and a commitment to our best. We need all students here for testing and on time. It is also important to note that State Testing has a strict no cell phone policy. Students are not allowed to have cell phones during testing. No cell phones.

Other dates to keep in mind- Wednesday April 2nd is an early release, dismissal at 1:20pm. Friday April 4th is half day, dismissal at 11:00am (end of quarter). April 10th no school for 6th and 7th graders and half day for 8th graders. April 18th school closed (Good Friday). April 23rd is an early release, dismissal at 1:20pm. May 6th is no school (Teacher PD). May 7th is an early release, dismissal at 1:20pm. May 28th is Honors Night (more information to follow). June 10th is the 8th Grade Celebration (more information to follow).

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M-Step Testing Schedule—Spring 2025

Below is the M-Step assessment schedule:

8th Grade (Math, English, Science and Social Studies)

7th Grade (Math and English only)

6th Grade (Math and English only)

PSAT Testing

Wednesday, April 10 is PSAT testing for 8th Grade students only. 6th and 7th grade students will not be attending school.

Important information to know about the PSAT 8/9 test:

- This test is required by the state of Michigan. Having your child in attendance and on time April 10th is CRITICAL.
- To ensure your child has the best testing atmosphere, Wednesday, April 10th will be an 8th Grade only day with dismissal at 11:30am.
- If your child misses the test, they will have to take the test on one of the optional make up days and will miss instructional time. Please have your child here on April 10th no later than 7:40am.
- The test takes approximately 3 hours with breaks.
- Students are required to stay for the entire time of testing.
- Cell phones, smart watches, earbuds are not allowed. Please leave them at home. If you bring them, you will be required to turn them into your proctor. You will get them back when testing is over.

When is sick too sick for school?

A regular attendance routine is important for your child's well-being and learning. These tips can help you decide when to keep your child home when they don't feel well.



SEND ME TO SCHOOL IF...

- I have a **runny nose** or just a **little cough**, but no other symptoms.
- I have **NOT had a fever overnight** and have **NOT taken fever reducing medicine** during that time.
- I have a **mild stomach ache**.
- I have **not thrown up** overnight and can drink liquids without throwing up.
- I have a **mild rash** and no other symptoms.
- I have **eye drainage WITHOUT fever**, eye pain or eyelid redness.



KEEP ME AT HOME IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4**.
- I have **thrown up two or more times** in the past 24 hours.
- My **stool is watery** and I may not make it to the bathroom in time.



SEEK MEDICAL CARE IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4 AND any of the following:** ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache, headache or tooth pain.
- I have **stomach pain and fever**, I have **bloody or black stool**, or I am **dehydrated** (tired and sleepy, dry mouth) and/or I have **not urinated** in the last 8 hours.
- I have a **persistent cough** or **trouble breathing**, or have a fever with the cough.
- I have **eye swelling, eye pain** or an **eye injury**.
- I have a **rash that has blisters**, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises, and/or I have a fever with the rash.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried your child will spread illness, contact your child's health care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department/school district health guidance including about contagious illnesses such as Covid-19 and the flu.

Fifth offense - Student surrenders the phone to the office. A parent/adult must pick up the phone from EMS. The student is issued an out of school suspension.

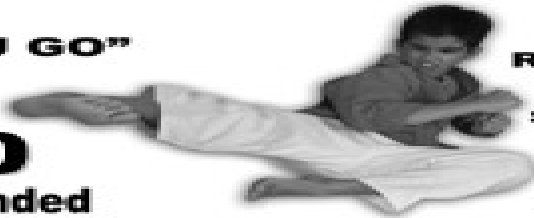
