Safety Drills

To help students prepare for emergencies, schools routinely practice drills for fire, tornado and lockdowns. Reminders: Eastland Middle School is a "closed campus" We do not accept third party lunch deliveries (such as Door Dash or Grub Hub) for student lunches. As always, Mom or Dad are welcome to drop off lunches in the Office.

If your child arrives at school after 8AM, they must be signed in at the Office by an adult. If you need to sign your student out early, or need to get your student a message, please call before 2:30PM. As dismissal approaches, the Office becomes more and more busy and it can be very difficult to get the message to the student, or call them to the Office.

Cell phones stay in lockers. The following is the discipline policy:

First Offense: Students turn phone/device into the Office and it can be picked up at the end of the day.

Second Offense: Students will receive a lunch detention, parent will be notified and parent must pick up the phone/device from the Office.

Third Offense: Student will receive an after school detention, parent will be notified and parent must pick up the phone/device at the end of the day.

Fourth Offense: Student will receive an after school detention, parent notification, parent must pick up device.

Fifth Offense: At home suspension, parent notification, parent must pick up device.
