#### Cell phones, Air Pods and other devices

As a reminder, school policy states that student cell phones are to be powered off and stored in their locker. Cell phones are a distraction and even sitting on a desk, pencil case or binder, can serve as a major distraction to community building and classroom learning. We would like to minimize screen time to focus on teacher direction, deepening cooperative learning and spur student conversations which lead to more in-depth learning.

#### Cell phones stay in lockers. The following is the discipline policy:

<u>First Offense:</u> Students turn phone/device into the Office and it can be picked up at the end of the day.

<u>Second Offense:</u> Students will receive a lunch detention, parent will be notified and parent must pick up the phone/device from the Office.

<u>Third Offense:</u> Student will receive an after school detention, parent will be notified and parent must pick up the phone/device at the end of the day.

<u>Fourth Offense</u>: Student will receive an after school detention, parent notification, parent must pick up device.

<u>Fifth Offense:</u> At home suspension, parent notification, parent must pick up device.
