

The Board strongly encourages and welcomes the involvement of parents/guardians in the District Title I Programs and Activities. The Board recognizes that parents/guardians are the "first teachers" of their children and that their interests and involvement in the education of their children should not diminish once their child enters the district's schools. The plan encompasses parent participation through meetings and other forms of communication. It shall be distributed to all parents and students through publication in the student handbook or other suitable means. Curriculum/Assessment



Title 1 provides federal funds to schools with high percentages of low-income students. These funds pay for extra educational services to help at risk students achieve and succeed regardless of any disadvantages through no fault of their own. At least 40% or more of our students must qualify for us to be considered a title one school.



How is Title I Money Used?

Title 1 funding is used in many ways to support student achievement.

Every year, our Title 1 Team evaluates the best way to utilize the funding.



Instructional Aides

Fountain has three aides, Monday through Friday, that push into classrooms to work with students. They also pull individuals and small groups to provide additional support. They work above and beyond the normal Tier 1 instruction.

After School Program

In the past, we have funded an afterschool tutoring program to provide additional support to our students. These students would stay afterschool and work on their math and reading skills.


