Dear Green Elementary Families:

We need your help! Regular attendance at school equals success for your child. When school is in session, students need to be here, even if it is cold. The state mandates a certain percentage of attendance each day or the school day won't count! That would mean we would have to make that day up at the end of the school year. Our curriculum builds on daily lessons as well. EVERY tardy, early release and absence can set your child behind.

**Also, our school day ends at 3:35PM.** Please schedule appointments after the end of the day. We request that students not be released early at all, but especially between 3:00-3:30PM. **No releases will be made after 3:00PM.** However, if they must leave early, the procedure is to come in, sign them out and we will call them down to the office at that time. Calling in advance is not necessary as we do not call students down until proper identification has been made.

Please be sure to let your kids know of any after school plans (where to go, who is picking them up) in the morning before school. Messages to the office after 3:00PM are difficult to guarantee getting to your child due to transitioning between classrooms as well as the hustle and bustle of the school day ending.

Late pick up times are another recurring problem. Please make every effort to be here for your child when school lets out at 3:35PM. The office closes shortly after the bell rings and we cannot leave any child unattended. If you are unable to pick up your child on time, please consider utilizing our Latchkey program. For more information call 586-445-5688.

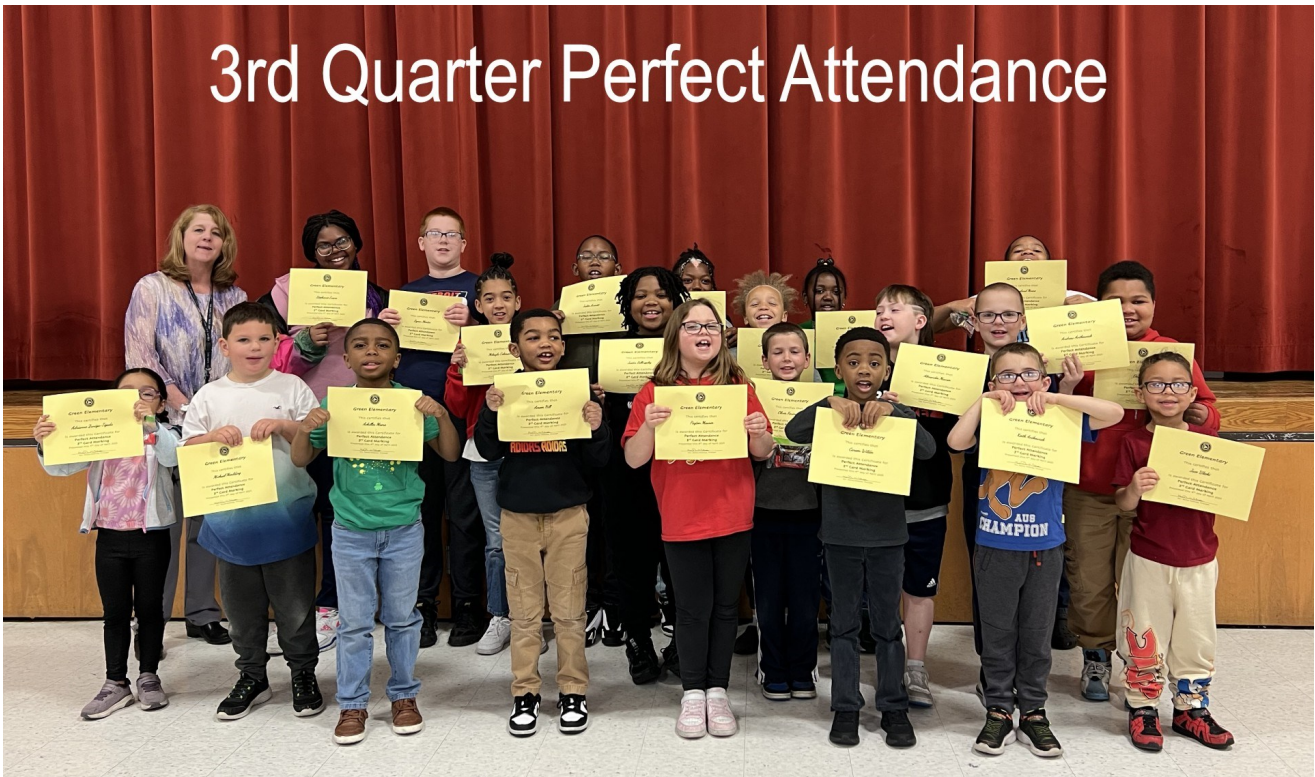
