Message from the Superintendent,

Hello Roseville Parents.

As the new year starts, we tend to set goals for the new year. I passionately request that you add one more to your list. Get your child to school every day possible.

Did you know that if your child is chronically absent, 18 absences or more in a school year, there are drastic affects to your child's learning and ultimately opportunities for success. Kindergarten students who are chronically absence will score 20% lower in reading and math and that gap will continue to grow as years go by. They will be twice as likely to be retained or suspended by the end of 7th grade.

High school students that are chronically absent for 1 year have a 36% rate of dropping out. 2 years is 51%, 3 years is 58% and 4 years is 61.3% drop out rate. I believe that every parent wants what is best for their child.

Getting your child to school every day is what is best for them. This includes half days as well. Getting your child to school everyday and making it a priority sends a positive message that education is important.

Let's start the new calendar year off on the right foot and help us help you educate your child and open opportunities for their future.
