

How we can help our families keep their children safe while online? One resource that is extremely important to make parents aware of is the Michigan Child Protection Registry. This registry is a do-not-contact service that families can easily and quickly sign up for at www.ProtectMIChild.com in order to keep your children safe while on their devices at school and at home. This is a free Registry offered through the State of Michigan that stops adult advertisements from reaching our kids through email, text, Snapchat, Twitter, Instagram, You Tube, Discord, Twitch and Tik Tok. This registry is an excellent resource for making sure our kids aren't being served ads for alcohol, tobacco/vaping, online gambling, pornography or marijuana.
