Happy Spring! The tulips are blooming, the temperatures are rising and the M-Step testing is looming. These online tests for grades 3-11 provide us with critical information on what students know and are able to do.

We want students' experience to be relaxed, healthy and stress-free. Make sure your student gets plenty of rest and arrives to school on time - particularly on test days. Grades 3 - 5 are tested in Mathematics and English-Language Arts, in addition 5th grade tests in Science and Social Studies. The online tests ask students to drag and drop, select text in a passage, select spots on a graph, match between two lists, fill-in-the-blank, or select multiple answers to a test question. They will also include a constructed response in which students will type in answers to questions.

These are the testing dates by grade: Tests begin at 9 am

5th grade April 22nd, 23rd, 29th, 30th, May 1st, 2nd, 6th & 7th

4th grade April 9th, 10th, 16th & 17th April 8th, 9th, 15th & 16th


