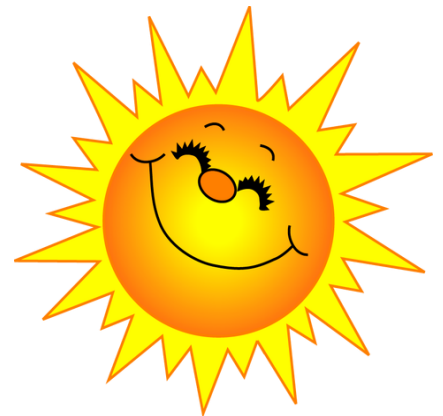

### Did You Move?

If you, or someone else you know, has a kindergarten through 5th grade student coming to Patton for the next school year, please come in as soon as possible to enroll. Call the office if you have any questions about enrollment requirements.

Parents, if your child has medication, inhalers or epi-pens in the school office, please be sure it is picked up by June 12th (by an adult). All medication/inhalers/epi-pens, etc. left at the school office will be disposed of on Monday, June 16th.



### Desk Clean Out Day! - Tuesday, June 10th

All students will be required to have their desks cleaned out on Tuesday, June 10th. NO BACKPACKS, PURSES, ETC. WILL BE ALLOWED IN SCHOOL on the last two days of school, June 11th & 12th (Wednesday & Thursday).

### Last Day of School

We are asking for parent cooperation in dealing with the last day of school. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD DOES NOT bring shaving cream, silly string or other similar items to school or near the school grounds.

While some students may find these fun, other students wish not to get caught in the crossfire.

We also have students that are allergic to these products. Thank you for your cooperation in making this a safe end of the school year!

### Lost & Found
