In April, we completed many of our state testing requirements, like PSAT and MSTEP. During the month of May we complete the final assessments, which is Benchmark Testing. Roseville Community Schools uses iReady to assess students' math and reading skills. Benchmark scores are used for many purposes. Scores will determine if students are placed in a math or reading support class during the following school year. The scores are also used when determining who takes an advanced class. Finally, the school and classroom teachers determine what content/skill they may need to provide more support in as we build our school improvement plan for next year.

June 4th from 7:00 to 8:00pm is our RMS Spring Concert. This beautiful event is a great way to show off the culminating work of our band department. This has accomplished a lot this year, which included earning an overall First Division rating at the MSBOA Band

and Orchestra Festival last week.



The 8th Grade Celebration will happen June 5th from 3:00 to 5:00pm at Roseville Middle School for all students. This event is for students only. Parents will have a chance to take pictures and pick their child up from 5:00-6:00pm in the front of the building (Barkman St) as we conclude the event. How is it possible that the year is almost over? We have watched the students mature, learn, grow, problem solve, and become more independent. Continue to discuss with your child what they are learning in school and how you can be involved in their education. Please ensure your child checks Power School for any missing assignments, as many teachers allow late submissions for the current quarter. The end of the year is fast approaching, and now is the time for students to catch up on their work. Often, students wait until the last week, and it may be too late. A friendly reminder to our 8th-grade students: the 8thgrade celebrations and awards night are coming up. If your student is suspended at any time during April, May, or June, they will not be allowed to attend these after-school special events. Our last three days of school will be half days, and students will have a cumulative task to complete on each of these days. This may be a project or test, and it is important that students attend these last three days, as the cumulative tasks will count towards their final grade.



Important updates regarding student attendance and behavior.

Attendance Class

Students with 35 or more tardies during the 3rd quarter in 2nd through 6th periods will be enrolled in the Attendance Class. This class will be held every Monday (A-K) and Friday (L-Z) from 2:55 PM to 3:30 PM in the Media Center until June 6th. A self-graded Schoology assignment on the importance of attendance is required for dismissal. Failure to attend will result in a one-day At-Home Suspension (AHS).

Communication Class

Additionally, students who receive 10 or more write-ups will be enrolled in the Communication Class. This class meets every Tuesday (A-K) and Thursday (L-Z) from 2:55 PM to 4:00 PM in the Computer Lab of the Media Center, continuing until June 6th. Students must complete a self-graded reading comprehension assignment and achieve a full week without write-ups to check in with the principal for exemption.

Missing this class will also result in a one-day AHS.

Parent Meetings

For repeated attendance or behavior issues, parent meetings will be scheduled to develop improvement plans. Effective communication between students and staff is essential for school success, ensuring that students stay informed and engaged.

RMS: Check In & Out

<u>Check-In:</u> Any student who arrives after 7:45 am must have an adult who is on their contact list with them to check them in at our Security Window at Door 1 to be allowed into RMS.

<u>Check-Out:</u> You are reminded that for any student who has an adult coming to the building to check them out, that adult must report to the Security Window to check a student out and must be on a student's contact list. We will not check out a student simply by a phone call from you stating you are here in the parking lot if the phone number you are calling from is not on our contact list.

Due to the high volume of calls we receive at the end of the day, we cannot guarantee that messages will be delivered to students after 2:30 each day. Additionally, parents who call or come to have their child released in the last 15 minutes of the day will be asked to wait until our normal dismissal time.

Student Drop-off and Pick-up

We would like to thank all of you that follow our procedures for drop off and pick up on a daily basis.

Remember, there is NO parking, stopping, or standing on Barkman Street, which means NO pickup or drop-off is allowed there.

We will continue to partner with the Roseville Police Department to have tickets issued to those that choose not to follow that ordinance. Dropping or picking up in the street is not safe, as it causes other cars to drive around the vehicles that are standing, endangering children that may not be paying attention.

The Martin Road parking lot is the only recommended drop-off and pick-up area. There is no street to cross, a crossing guard is present and traffic moves quickly, smoothly, and safely.

Reminder: Please DO NOT park in the bus loop starting at 2:30pm to pick up your student, the buses are trying to come and get set up for dismissal. Parking in the bus loop will cause delays in the buses being able to leave on time.

Whenever possible, we would appreciate it if you would make after school and transportation arrangements before your child leaves home in the morning.
