When Should I Call?

There are several different reasons that Mobile Crisis can be requested:

- A child is experiencing a mental health crisis and assistance is needed in managing the situation.
- A child is experiencing suicidal ideation and/or participating in self-injurious behaviors.
- It is reasonably expected that a child within the near future will physically injure themselves or another individual, either intentionally or unintentionally.
- A child exhibits risk behaviors and/or emotional symptoms which are noticeable from their usual behavior.
- Requires immediate assistance to help prevent when possible taking the child to the hospital and/or calling the police.

Who can call:

Those who need assistance must be a Macomb County resident.

Any adult working with the youth who has parental permission can call including but not limited to:

- Parent/Guardian
- Caregiver
- Grandparent
- School staff
- Therapist

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I CALL?

- Staff at the Macomb County Crisis Center will answer your call.
- That staff will obtain basic information including: your youth's name, health insurance information, birthdate, your address, and phone number.
- You can request the Mobile Crisis team.
- Staff will transfer your call to the Mobile Crisis Therapist on call.
- The Mobile Crisis Therapist will assess current situation and deploy if needed and/or requested.

Deployment:

- The highly trained Mobile Crisis team is comprised of a Master's Level Therapist and a Parent Support Partner (PSP).
- The role of the PSP is to support the adult through the crisis.
- The role of the Mobile Crisis Therapist is to support the youth through the crisis and provided immediate intervention services to deescalate the crisis to maintain them in the community and avert the need for hospitalization and/or police intervention.
- Before leaving the location, the Mobile Crisis Team will ensure there is a safety plan in place.

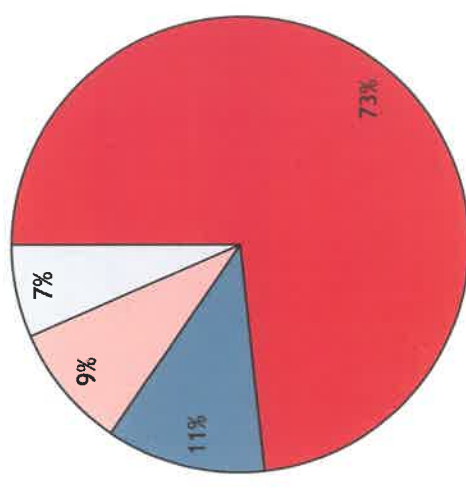
HOURS OF OPERATION
