Device Reminders

What we see and hear:

Parents go two ways with phones. Some parents are in favor of strict bans and want us to hold these boundaries. Other parents are calling and texting students during school and get upset at us for dealing with phones.

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Why we need them away during instruction:

All the reasons below tie into our core school values of Responsibility, Healthy Decisions, and Safety we actively teach students

Learning: High School students are still developing their executive functioning skills; they have a difficult time staying away from social media and controlling impulses. They need to be taught digital citizenship skills and how to have a healthy relationship with screen time.

Work skills: Adults can't always be on their cellphone at work. Even though as a society we're used to being able to quickly reach others and get an immediate response, parents can still reach their child through the school office.

Social Media Issues: There are also issues around bullying on social media. It's even more important than ever to teach students how to make positive decisions in and out of school. Some students have a very unhealthy relationship with technology and struggle without that dopamine fix of getting likes, comments and followers. This sometimes drives students to do more and more questionable things to get those online interactions. Because social media is a space not monitored by adults, students feel empowered to do things that wouldn't be allowed in other spaces. This also means there are no adults around to help process what happens, and to provide guidance as students navigate the online world.

State Testing and School Calendar Changes

As we do every April, RHS will be having students participate in the required State of Michigan Assessments.

We will have a "Change of Building Schedule" for April 9th and 10th to allow us to have students participate in testing in a small, focused environment to help ensure their success:

Wednesday, April 9

- 10th grade students report 7:40 10:15 to take the PSAT 10. Breakfast will be provided.
- 11th grade students report 10:30 2:45 to take the PSAT. Early lunch will be provided to 11th grade only
- · Note dismissal times are based on students being at school on time for testing to begin.
- 9th and 12th grade students do not have school on this day.

Thursday, April 10

- 9th grade students report 7:40 10:15 to take the PSAT 8/9. Breakfast will be provided.
- 11th grade students report 10:15 2:45 to take the ACT WorkKeys. Early lunch will be provided to 11th grade only.
- · Note dismissal times are based on students being at school on time for testing to begin.
- 12th Grade reports 1:30 2:45 pm for their Spring Senior Class Meeting to go over the end of the year and Prom, National Decision Day and Graduation slideshow info confirmation, Senior final requirements, and participate in getting ready for other end of senior year celebratory tasks.
- 10th grade students do not have school on this day.

Students in our Cognitively Impaired Special Education Program who take the Mi-Access as their required state assessment will not report either day.






Roseville grad and member of the first hall of fame class,

Protecting Families from Predatory Marketing

What is the Child Protection Registry?

The Child Protection Registry has been a success since 2005 in Utah and Michigan. Modeled after the national Do-Not-Call legislation it is a "Do-Not-Contact" program that allows families to prevent adult product solicitations to their electronic contact points. This registry blocks advertisements or promotions of products that minors are prohibited from purchasing, including alcohol, tobacco/vaping, gambling, pornography and illegal drugs/marijuana. The Michigan Child Protection Registry is administered under the Michigan Secretary of State Office.

Why is a registry like this important?

Children as young as two are spending more time on computers, tablets and cell phones than ever before. Marketers, selling adultoriented products, are also using technology more and more to promote their brands and services. Unfortunately, the solicitations these companies are sending are falling in front of the eyes of minors through their email, text messages, and certain apps. We have laws in place to protect children from this kind of marketing in stores, in magazines, and on television—the registry would extend those protections to the digital world.

Who can register?

Any electronic contact point to which a minor may have access can register for this service free-of-charge, including parents, grandparents, care-givers, schools and institutions.

How does it work?

Individuals interested in not receiving adult product solicitations can register their email addresses, Snapchat, Instagram, Twitter, TikTok, Discord, Twitch, YouTube and cell phone numbers at www.ProtectMIChild.com. Adult-oriented solicitors will then scrub their contact lists against the registry. Registered emails and other "contact points" will then be removed. The marketers will NOT have access to the actual contact point information. The registry does not store in its database a list of identifiable subscribers.

Do children still use email?

Social media sites and mobile apps require an email address to register for their service. Many schools require children to have email addresses to correspond with their teachers. Email is still a preferred form of communication and will continue to be into the future.

How is the registry enforced?

Violations will be reported by recipients, at which point fines may be assessed. Marketers have 30 days to scrub registered contact points from their lists before complaints may be filed.

What's the fiscal impact?

The registry generates its revenue by charging adult product marketers a small fee based on the number of addresses they check against the registry, so there will be no fiscal impact to any state that participates. In fact, the Utah and Michigan registries have generated a nominal revenue for those states.

Does it work?

Today over one million contact points have been protected in both Utah and Michigan. Since going live, both states have generated over a combined \$1.25 Million in revenue to protect children online, and millions of adult content messages have been blocked from targeting children and families.
