IMPORTANT INFO FOR ALL PARENTS TO KNOW: State Testing and School Calendar Changes

As we do every April, RHS will be having students participate in the required State of Michigan Assessments.

We will have a "Change of Building Schedule" for April 9th and 10th to allow us to have students participate in testing in a small, focused environment to help ensure their success:

Wednesday, April 9

- 10th grade students report 7:40 – 10:15 to take the PSAT 10. Breakfast will be provided.
- 11th grade students report 10:30 – 2:45 to take the PSAT. Early lunch will be provided to 11th grade only
- *Note dismissal times are based on students being to school on time for testing to begin.*
- 9th and 12th grade students do not have school on this day.

Thursday, April 10

- 9th grade students report 7:40 – 10:15 to take the PSAT 8/9. Breakfast will be provided.
- 11th grade students report 10:15 – 2:45 to take the ACT WorkKeys. Early lunch will be provided to 11th grade only.
- *Note dismissal times are based on students being to school on time for testing to begin.*
- 12th Grade reports 1:30 – 2:45 pm for their Spring Senior Class Meeting to go over the end of the year and Prom, National Decision Day and Graduation slideshow info confirmation, Senior final requirements, and participate in getting ready for other end of senior year celebratory tasks.
- 10th grade students do not have school on this day.

Students in our Cognitively Impaired Special Education Program who take the Mi-Access as their required state assessment will not report either day.

Eligibility:

- Graduating Roseville High School Seniors
- Will be attending some type of post-secondary training after high school and enrolling in the areas of:
 - *Manufacturing, Metallurgy, Automotive Technology, CAD Drafting, or any Engineering program*
- Have completed ALL of the SAT/MME testing
- Must have a **Cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher**
 - *(ask your counselor if you don't know yours)*

Application Process:

- Provide proof of acceptance to an accredited two or four year college
- **Completed application (typed or black pen)**
- Include a **250-word essay on hard work**
 - *(see section B of application)*
- Include a copy of 12th grade attendance
 - *(counseling office will supply)*
- **2 references/letters from teachers or community members**
 - *(in sealed, signed envelopes)*

Expectations:

- Complete all parts of the application.
- Incomplete applications will be disqualified
- Do **NOT** put your name on front of essay....**write it on the back ONLY.**

These athletes have been working hard! But wait, that's not all!

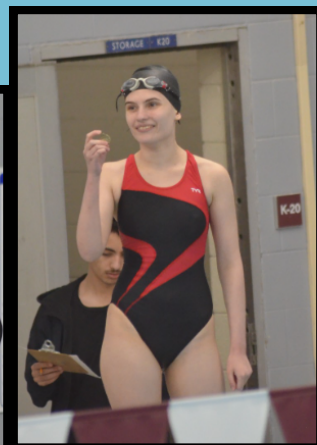

Class time will not be interrupted for delivery of forgotten items.

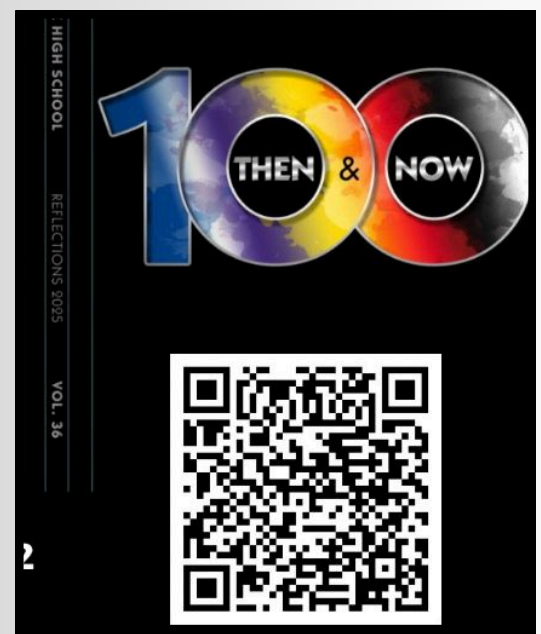



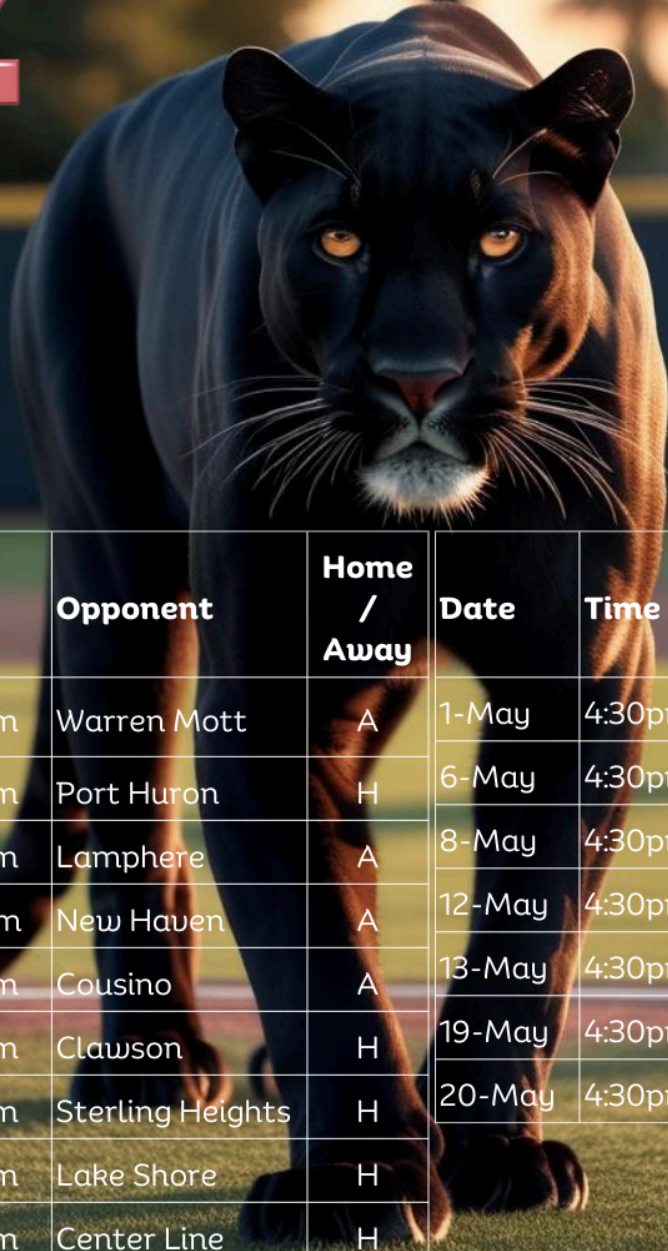
