I hope everyone had an enjoyable Thanksgiving holiday and is ready for the longer Winter Holiday Break that is coming up. As a reminder, the dates of that break are December 23<sup>rd</sup> - January 7. School will resume Monday, January 8. That does not leave much time until the semester ends on January 26, so please be sure your student is completing their classwork, and make sure you are monitoring their progress through our Parent Portal as well to help make sure they earn credit at the end of the First Semester.

I want to give some special congratulations this month. RHS Junior, Daniel Duhaylonsond, was just accepted to the 2024 Michigan All-State Band for the second year in a row. He will perform with at the Michigan Music Conference on January 27. I would also like to offer congratulations for two of our athletic programs. Our Varsity Football team had another great season, winning their second MHSAA District Championship in program history, which is also their second District Championship in the last four years. Our Volleyball team made it to the MHSAA District semi-finals, their best performance in many years.

### Report Cards, Extra Help During Flex Time, Credit Recovery Info:

By now you should have received your student's 1<sup>st</sup> quarter report card. They were emailed to the email address we have on file for you as a parent/guardian. If you did not receive a report card through email, please contact us.

Every Tuesday and Thursday RHS has a special period called "FLEX." This is a period where students can sign up to receive additional help and support in classes where they most need it during the school day. At RHS we understand all students learn at different paces, and not every student may master a concept the first time they learn it. FLEX allows our high school students to get help where and when they need it to continue on their path towards graduation. If you have not done so yet, speak with your student and have them show you the FLEX sessions they are signing up for.

As a reminder, all students earn credit based on their semester grades, and there are credit requirements students must fulfill to graduate from RHS. **Be aware, credit recovery costs \$150 per class needed.** Please make sure you are monitoring your student's progress on the Parent Portal, asking them to show you what FLEX sessions they are signed out for, and reaching out to their teachers through the Parent Portal if you have questions. A student's best chance for success and staying on track for graduation is by having regular school attendance, being engaged in their daily classes, utilizing FLEX, and passing their daily classes the first time through them, when there is no cost.

### General Reminders:

- All students are expected to bring their laptops, fully charged, to school with them each day. If you owe a fine, please contact our Technology Department to work out payment options.
- Senior Parents: Be sure you are paying attention to senior parent emails regarding Graduation information, scholarship opportunities, and college and trade school visits at RHS.
- Instruction starts at 7:40 am each day. Your student should be arriving at school no later than 7:35 am to make it to class on time. Discipline is issued to students who are regularly late to school.
- If your student arrives after 1<sup>st</sup> hour ends, they must be checked in by a parent/guardian at our security window or by phone. This is an important safety/security measure to ensure you know where your child is when you expect them to be in school.
- Please do not call/text your student during school hours, it is a disruption to instructional time. Contact our Main Office to deliver any messages you would like them to receive.

**i** Information on SMS text messaging and Short Codes:

SMS stands for Short Message Service and is commonly referred to as a “text message”. Most cell phones support this type of text messaging. Our notification provider, SchoolMessenger, uses a true SMS protocol developed by the telecommunications industry specifically for mass text messaging, referred to as “short code” texting. This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers. If you’ve ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.

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**If you aren't receiving text messages, especially our Sunday 3pm text AND/OR accompanying email, our weekly feedback report shows it is because the receiving end has either blocked or unsubscribed from our text OR email service. PLEASE do not 'opt out' or 'unsubscribe' or 'block' the text messages and/or emails! This is the same communication system that we will use in the event of an emergency to keep you informed.**

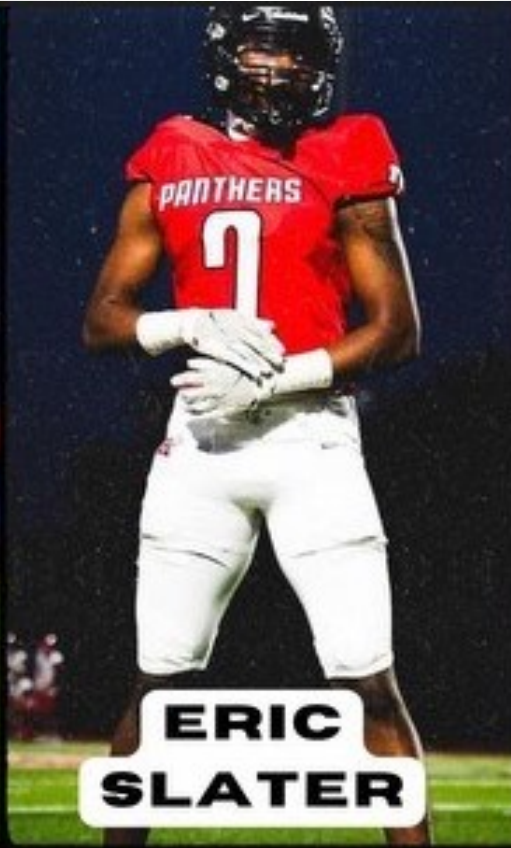

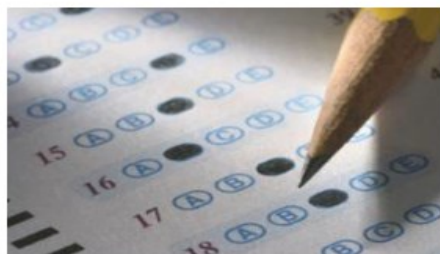

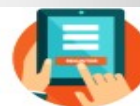
