Happy New Year and welcome to 2024!



I hope all of you had an enjoyable holiday over the extended break from school. As we enter January and think of resolutions and new commitments here are some conversations you could continue to have with your student to keep them focused in on their success in school.

- Remind your student to bring their charged laptop to school each day.
- Talk about the importance of following our cell phone policy. Students today are so connected to their devices it impacts their learning. As a parent, consider using screen time limit features that most phones have in the settings, especially if you pay the bill for it.
- Have your student check on their grades and progress regularly in the PowerSchool accounts.
- Ask your student what FLEX sessions they are signing up for each Tuesday and Thursday. As a reminder, FLEX is time built into our school week where students can get help where they need it, when they need it.
- Finally, as a parent, make sure you are signed up for our Parent Portal where you can review grades and attendance at all times, as well as email your student's teachers.

### **Important Information Going Into The New Year:**

Roseville High School is on a semester schedule system. First semester ends January 26, with final exam dates on January 25 and 26. Here is some important information about exams, semesters, and grading:

- · Final exams will cover all material learned in the first semester (since school started in September).
- · Students are expected to be in school to take final exams. There are no make-up exam dates. The only exception is medically excused absences.
- · Semester grades are used to determine whether a student a student earns the required credit for graduation and are calculated into their cumulative GPA.
- · To receive credit to graduate, a student must have a passing semester grade in the class.
- · Semester grades are calculated as follows:
- -1<sup>st</sup> marking period grade: **40%** of semester grade (this has already been finalized).
- -2<sup>nd</sup> marking period grade: **40%** of semester grade (2<sup>nd</sup> marking period ends Wed., Jan 25).
- -Semester Exam grade: +20% of semester grade (Jan 26 and 27).
- -Semester grade= **100% of the above 3 grades**.

Again, to receive credit towards graduation, the semester grade MUST be a passing grade in each class.

After school credit recovery exists only for Juniors and Seniors. A<u>II after school credit recovery will cost \$150 per class.</u> Starting this summer, summer credit recovery will cost \$200 per class. This means it is incredibly important, particularly for freshmen and sophomores, that they are passing their classes and earning credit now.

### Here are some important items to know for Seniors:

### FAFSA:

The federal government launched the new and improved, easier to use financial aid portal, FAFSA, on December 31. Here are a few of the major changes:

- The application will be streamlined and contain new terminology.
- Since all Michigan public school students receive free lunch, students and parents/guardians should check that box when filing the FAFSA. This will allow them to forgo the asset questions.
- The FAFSA will use a different calculation to determine a student's financial aid eligibility.
- Financial information can be pulled directly from the IRS to streamline FAFSA filing.
- The term Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) will change to the Student Aid Index (SAI). The Michigan Achievement Scholarship will change eligibility requirements accordingly.

Cost is \$20, cash only. QR code is posted below and on page 4 of this publication, is posted in the building, Schoology, and will be sent home.
- 5. January 27: "All The Hassle Before the Tassel Vendor Show. RHS gyms from 11:00 AM 3:00 PM.
- 6. <u>January 30</u>: There will be a Senior class student meeting during FLEX. All seniors will be scheduled into this meeting for their FLEX session.
- 7. January 31: Last day for senior photos to be provided to be included into the yearbook. Upload photos to <a href="https://www.yearbookforever.com">www.yearbookforever.com</a>
- 8. <u>Diploma sheets</u> (which verify the spelling of the legal name that will appear on diplomas) will be distributed in January and are due back in February.
- 9. <u>February 9</u>: The deadline for the Roseville Scholarship Foundation \$1,000 Scholarships. Last year, over \$60,000 in scholarships were given by the Scholarship Foundation to RHS Seniors. Be sure to apply!

### **Items to Know:**

- 1. All seniors must pass both semesters of English 12.
- 2. Roseville Scholarship Foundation Applications are now available in the Counseling Office. Any RHS Senior with a GPA of 2.0 or higher should apply for this \$1,000 scholarship. Deadline is February 9.
- 3. Be sure your student's counselor has their personal email address to receive our Senior Emails that are sent at least once a month. The school forwards these emails to parents using the email address we have on file. If you are not receiving them, calls us at (586) 445-5542.
- 4. If you have not registered for FAFSA (Financial Aid) now is the time to do so. Speak with your counselor for more information.
- Remember to turn in your acceptance letters to college, trade school or the armed services to the Counseling Office to receive your #Accepted t-shirt for our end of the year Senior #Accepted parade.

Message from the Superintendent,

Hello Roseville Parents.

As the new year starts, we tend to set goals for the new year. I passionately request that you add one more to your list. Get your child to school every day possible.

Did you know that if your child is chronically absent, 18 absences or more in a school year, there are drastic affects to your child's learning and ultimately opportunities for success.

Kindergarten students who are chronically absence will score 20% lower in reading and math and that gap will continue to grow as years go by. They will be twice as likely to be retained or suspended by the end of 7<sup>th</sup> grade.

High school students that are chronically absent for 1 year have a 36% rate of dropping out. 2 years is 51%, 3 years is 58% and 4 years is 61.3% drop out rate. I believe that every parent wants what is best for their child.

Getting your child to school every day is what is best for them. This includes half days as well. Getting your child to school everyday and making it a priority sends a positive message that education is important.

Let's start the new calendar year off on the right foot and help us help you educate your child and open opportunities for their future.







Visitor Entrance, Drop off and Pickup Instructions

- The RHS Visitor Entrance is Door #1. This door is accessed by parking in the Visitor Parking lot located in the North Lot.
- Student pick up and drop off is in the NORTH LOT. Please pick up drop off at the Athletic Entrance following the traffic pattern on the map.
- 3. The South Lot is for staff parking and Bus Drop Off/Pick Up ONLY.
- Student parking is in the North Lot. Students must purchase a parking pass from the Main Office for \$40 to park at school.
- Normal St. Curbside drop off should only occur on the west (school) side of the street, not the east (private homes) side. This prevents students from having to cross the street at our busiest times of day, especially when it is dark.

Students may also bring a cold lunch from home if they so choose.


A closed campus also means students are not allowed to leave for lunch.
