We frequently get questions from parents asking if we offer tutoring. During Advisory time, Thursday's we offer Wildcat Time. This is the time teachers can pull groups of students to provide the support they need.

- Provide extra time for students that need the extra time and support required to learn what is taught in their classes in a small group setting. This could involve reteaching the concept or some extra time/support to complete a missing assignment to name a few options.
- Provide additional social/emotional/behavioral support to students in need.
- Provide enrichment to students that are excelling in their classes.

If your child is struggling in class, reach out to their teachers about scheduling your student for support during an upcoming Wildcat time.

Did you know RMS has an Attendance Liaison? Ms. Cheryl Brown's job is to work with families to remove barriers and support families to improve their child's attendance. She will be out for a few weeks, but when she returns, she will be calling and meeting with families to support student attendance. Attached on the next page are some important reminders for Attendance Works.



Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Make school attendance a priority

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- Help your children maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and non-urgent related medical appointments during the school day.
- Keep your student healthy. If you are concerned about about a contagious illness, call your school or health care provider.
- If your children must stay home because they are sick, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

Help your teen stay engaged

- Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your teens are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage your child to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- Support your students if you notice signs of anxiety, and if needed, seek advice from your school or health provider

Communicate with the school

- Know the school's attendance policy – incentives and penalties.
- Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- Seek help from school staff, other parents, or community agencies if you need support.

Need Help Solving A Problem

You Are Having Involving School Related Issues?

We understand Middle School can be more complex than Elementary School. Your child can have contact with up to 7 different teachers every day, 3 different principals, and multiple support staff members. To help your child experience success, we recommend you;

- Familiarize yourself with your child's daily schedule.
- Monitor their grades and tardiness on Power School (sign up in the main office for the Parent Portal, if not already registered).
- Take advantage of our many support opportunities.
- Be involved in the school with opportunities we have for parents. We need your help.

In doing all this you still may encounter an area you need help with, the following steps were created to help you navigate through any potential issue and ensure that you are helped as quickly as possible;

Step 1: Talk to your child to understand and identify the problem. If more needs to be done;

Step 2: Contact the employee (i.e. teacher, coach, bus driver, etc.) closest to the situation to understand the issue from their perspective and to discuss a plan or strategy to resolve the situation. If resolution cannot be reached;

Step 3: Communicate with the direct supervisor (i.e. principal, assistant principal, athletic director, transportation supervisor, etc.) or the employee. If you're convinced that further action is required;

Step 4: Schedule a meeting with the appropriate administrator and discuss what has been done so far and any concerns you still may have.

Student Drop-off and Pick-up

We would like to thank all of you that follow our procedures for drop off and pick up on a daily basis.

Remember, there is NO parking, stopping, or standing on Barkman Street, which means NO pick-up or drop-off is allowed there.

We will continue to partner with the Roseville Police Department to have tickets issued to those that choose not to follow that ordinance. Dropping or picking up in the street is not safe, as it causes other cars to drive around the vehicles that are standing, endangering children that may not be paying attention.

The Martin Road parking lot is the only recommended drop-off and pick-up area. There is no street to cross, a crossing guard is present and traffic moves quickly, smoothly, and safely.

Reminder: Please DO NOT park in the bus loop starting at 2:30pm, (1:00 ER, 10:40 Half day) to pick up your student, the buses are trying to come and get set up for dismissal. Parking in the bus loop will cause delays in the buses being able to leave on time.

Whenever possible, we would appreciate it if you would make after school and transportation arrangements before your child leaves home in the morning.
