RMS Families

We are finishing up our iReady testing in the next few weeks. This benchmark test helps us know student skill levels in reading and math. This information helps us create and provide the support needed to make sure all students get what they need in school. This may include a reading or math support class during advisory. If your child scored more than one grade level below their current grade, you will be getting information soon. It is important as a parent to understand exactly where your child is academically. The next benchmark assessment will be in the winter. This is when we expect all students to show growth because they have had 3 months of instruction in the classrooms.

Attendance is an essential part of student achievement. Families can help the school out by making sure their child attends school and arrives on time. School starts at 7:45am, so students are recommended to be in the building around 7:35am. This extra time gives students a chance to get everything put away in their locker and ready for class. If a student is late for the school day they will be missing important academic instruction. Did you know that 95% of our students get to class on time? If you notice a pattern of tardies on your child's PowerSchool, they are making a choice to be late to class.

We plan to start our Wildcat Time in the next few weeks. This program will take place on Thursdays during Advisory. Why are we starting Wildcat Time?

- Give students that need it the extra time and support required to learn what is taught in their classes in a small group setting. This could involve reteaching the concept by the teacher or some extra time to complete a missing assignment.
- Provide additional social/emotional/behavioral support to students in need.
- Provide enrichment opportunities to students that are excelling in their classes.

Parent Teacher Conferences will be held on Wednesday, October 15. Parents again this year will have the option of conferences face-to-face and virtually. We do have limited virtual openings, so it will be on a first sign-up basis.

- 12:05-2:50pm Afternoon Conferences. Virtual ONLY option for families. If you pick this option, you will sign up for slots like the past few years. This will be emailed out.
- 5:00-8:00pm Evening Conferences. Face-to-face ONLY option for families. The conference will be held in the gym.

We are well into the school year and students are settling in nicely. As we continue with the year, we will continue to work on expectations in regards to cell phones, homework, behavior in classrooms and hallways.

Cell phones are to be turned off AND KEPT IN LOCKERS from 7:45 to 2:50 each day. Parents, if you need to contact your child, please call the office, and leave a message for them. Students who have their phones taken away will get it back for the 1st and 2nd time. After that, students will need to have their phone picked up by an adult, and additional discipline will be issued.

Please continue to check your child's Parent Portal to keep up with missing work, grades, and attendance. Please review with your child the importance of behavior expectations at school. Hands on behavior is not acceptable and will not be tolerated. We want all our students to be safe here before, during, and after school. If they receive a detention, please make arrangements to have them serve it within a week. School rules extend to after-school events as well, including sporting events and after-school activities.

Annual Asbestos Notification

Roseville Community Schools have complied with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Act, commonly referred to as AHERA. AHERA provides a framework for addressing asbestos problems in public and private elementary and secondary schools. The regulations provide a comprehensive scheme for school to access and respond to potential asbestos problems in their buildings. This compliance was carried out by:

- 1. Having all buildings inspected by an accredited inspector.
- 2. Developing an asbestos management plan for each school and submitting a copy to the Governor.
- 3. Providing copies of the report and management plan, which are on file in each of the schools' administrative offices and can be viewed by any interested party.
- 4. Re-inspecting all school buildings every six months. If there are any questions regarding asbestos in the Roseville Community Schools, contact Joe Smith, Director, Buildings & Grounds, at (586) 445-5697.

Safety Drills

To help students prepare for emergencies, schools routinely practice drills for fire, tornado, and lockdowns. In the event of a building crisis, doors will be closed or locked, lights turned out, and window blinds closed. Students will be moved away from the door and remain quiet until there is an "All Clear" from the office.

As part of our security protocols, please be aware that we do not share evacuation locations, per recommendations from law enforcement. In the event of an evacuation, know that our first priority is always safely and quickly moving students and staff, and then informing parents of the next steps. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. No Smoking Policy A State law prohibits smoking in or on school property. This includes district-owned buildings or vehicles and property owned, leased, or otherwise controlled by the school district. The law, along with Roseville Board policy, seeks to model behavior that supports district curriculum regarding health and safety. Need Help Solving A Problem

You Are Having Involving School Related Issues?

We understand Middle School can be more complex than Elementary School. Your child can have contact with up to 7 different teachers every day, 3 different principals, and multiple support staff members. To help your child experience success, we recommend you;

- Familiarize yourself with your child's daily schedule.
- Monitor their grades and tardiness on Power School (sign up in the main office for the Parent Portal, if not already registered).
- Take advantage of our many support opportunities.
- Be involved in the school with opportunities we have for parents. We need your help.

In doing all this you still may encounter an area you need help with, the following steps were created to help you navigate through any potential issue and ensure that you are helped as quickly as possible;

Step 1: Talk to your child to understand and identify the problem. If more needs to be done;

Step 2: Contact the employee (i.e. teacher, coach, bus driver, etc.) closest to the situation to understand the issue from their perspective and to discuss a plan or strategy to resolve the situation. If resolution cannot be reached;

Step 3: Communicate with the direct supervisor (i.e. principal, assistant principal, athletic director, transportation supervisor, etc.) or the employee. If you're convinced that further action is required;

Step 4: Schedule a meeting with the appropriate administrator and discuss what has been done so far and any concerns you still may have.

When is sick too sick for school?

A regular attendance routine is important for your child's well-being and learning. These tips can help you decide when to keep your child home when they don't feel well.



SEND ME TO SCHOOL IF...

- I have a **runny nose** or just a **little cough**, but no other symptoms.
- I have **NOT** had a **fever overnight** and have **NOT** taken fever reducing medicine during that time.
- I have a **mild stomach ache**.
- I have **not thrown up** overnight and can drink liquids without throwing up.
- I have a **mild rash** and no other symptoms.
- I have **eye drainage WITHOUT** fever, eye pain or eyelid redness.



KEEP ME AT HOME IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4**
- I have **thrown up two or more times** in the past 24 hours.
- My **stool is watery** and I may not make it to the bathroom in time.



SEEK MEDICAL CARE IF...

- I have a **temperature higher than 100.4 AND any of the following**: ear pain, sore throat, rash, stomachache, headache or tooth pain.
- I have **stomach pain and fever**, I have **bloody or black stool**, or I am **dehydrated** (tired and sleepy, dry mouth) and/or I have **not urinated** in the last 8 hours.
- I have a **persistent cough** or **trouble breathing**, or have a fever with the cough.
- I have **eye swelling, eye pain** or an **eye injury**.
- I have a **rash that has blisters**, is draining, is painful, looks like bruises, and/or I have a fever with the rash.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school, have specific concerns regarding your child's physical or mental health, or are worried your child will spread illness, contact your child's health care provider, a local urgent care or the school nurse. These tips are not meant to take the place of local health department/school district health guidance including about contagious illnesses such as Covid-19 and the flu.

Student Drop-off and Pick-up

We would like to thank all of you that follow our procedures for drop off and pick up on a daily basis.

Remember, there is NO parking, stopping, or standing on Barkman Street, which means NO pick-up or drop-off is allowed there.

We will continue to partner with the Roseville Police Department to have tickets issued to those that choose not to follow that ordinance. Dropping or picking up in the street is not safe, as it causes other cars to drive around the vehicles that are standing, endangering children that may not be paying attention.

The Martin Road parking lot is the only recommended drop-off and pick-up area. There is no street to cross, a crossing guard is present and traffic moves quickly, smoothly, and safely.

Reminder: Please DO NOT park in the bus loop starting at 2:30pm, (1:00 ER, 10:40 Half day) to pick up your student, the buses are trying to come and get set up for dismissal. Parking in the bus loop will cause delays in the buses being able to leave on time.

Whenever possible, we would appreciate it if you would make after school and transportation arrangements before your child leaves home in the morning.

RMS: Check In & Out

Check-In: Any student who arrives after 7:45 am must have an adult who is on their contact list with them to check them in at our Security Window at Door 1 to be allowed into RMS.

Check-Out: You are reminded that for any student who has an adult coming to the building to check them out, that adult must report to the Security Window to check a student out and must be on a student's contact list. We will not check out a student simply by a phone call from you stating you are here in the parking lot if the phone number you are calling from is not on our contact list.

Due to the high volume of calls we receive at the end of the day, we cannot guarantee that messages will be delivered to students after 2:30 each day. Additionally, parents who call or come to have their child released in the last 15 minutes of the day will be asked to wait until our normal dismissal time.

It is extremely important that we have up-to-date contact information for every student. This includes the home address and parent phone numbers, as well as emergency contact information to assist us if we are unable to reach a parent. This information will aid us in keeping you informed of medical emergencies, school happenings, and many other important activities. Please email kwentzel@roseville.k12.mi.us with any changes in the primary phone number or email, and we will update our records for you. Address changes require three proofs of residency brought to the Main Office. If you have recently moved or changed your phone number, please notify us as soon as possible at 586-445-5613.
