State of Michigan - New Student Assessment

MSTEP testing starts April 7, 2025 and ends May 8, 2025. Please encourage your student to be in school every day for the full day and to arrive on time. Make sure they get plenty of rest the night before testing.

The Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress, or M-STEP, is a 21st Century computer-based assessment designed to gauge how well students are mastering state standards. When combined with classroom work, report cards, local assessments and other tools, M-STEP results offer a comprehensive view of student progress and achievement. Students in grades 3-5 can access practice test items using a computer browser (https://wbte.drcedirect.com/MI/portals/mi). Or by opening the DRC Insight app on their school laptop. At Steenland, students in Grade 3 and 4 will be tested in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Students in Grade 5 will be tested in ELA, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science.

PROPER DRESS CODE

Reasonable standards for student dress and personal appearance are essential requirements in the maintenance of an acceptable climate for effective instruction. The great majority of students in Roseville take pride in good appearance. They dress in a manner which reflects favorably upon their school, their class, and themselves.

- 1) Shorts, skirts, and skorts will not be more than 4 inches above the knee.
- 2) Hats, Coats and outerwear should be stored in lockers.
- 3) Sagging Pants Slacks, jeans, shorts, etc. are to be worn at the waist, not hanging low on the hips, or exposing undergarments. Undergarments are defined as any clothing worn under the outer garment.
- 4) Shoes All students are required to wear shoes.

<u>Elementary: All students are required to wear socks and shoes, not slippers or flip flops.</u> <u>Sandals must have heel straps.</u>

Prohibited Apparel:

Tank tops/muscle shirts

See-through clothing

Flags shall not be worn in a demeaning manner

Inappropriate slogans and emblems (i.e. references to alcohol, drugs, or sex)

Exposed undergarments low cut shirts

Gang clothing, bandanas - gang related dress (i.e., emblems) that suggests membership or promotion is prohibited.
